Extract. Deciding on the urgency of treatment is more important than making an exact diagnosis. The first thing to do is to decide whether the patient can return back home or does he/she need referral to a hospital, further investigations or an urgent operation. The reported incidence is 1/4500, and more than 80% occurs before the age of two as an acute abdomen or bowel obstruction. The most common site is Ileum (60%), while the colonic localisation is reported between 4 and 18%. Abstract. Two different series collected at the University Hospital of Freiburg are presented as a basis for the critical appraisal of available imaging tests and their correlation with anatomic pain sites.
