

# Download Civic Engagement In The Wake Of Katrina

Brown v. Board of Education Case Didn't Start How You Think It Did. History ultimately would not be on the side of the majority of Topeka's black community. Ten years ago, Hurricane Katrina not only devastated New Orleans and the Gulf Coast. It also shattered the confidence Americans had in their government to respond to domestic emergencies. For 10 years, Social Psychology Network held an international action teaching award competition with two main goals: (1) to honor creative action teaching, and (2) to freely disseminate effective action teaching techniques to a wide audience. Last year, 2016, was the first year since Hurricane Katrina that more people left New Orleans than moved in domestically—that has a lot to do with the dismal job market that continues to repel young professionals. - Civic Engagement In The Wake Of Katrina
